**June 2025**

**PARKS DIVISION REPORT**

**MOTION**

Motion to recommend to the full board to include the Parks, Planning & Maintenance June Board Report in the June Executive Directors Report.

**ADMINISTRATION & CAPITAL PROJECTS**

**Vogelei Park OSLAD**

Staff have been in the planning process of phase two of this park for the last couple of months and have begun implementing those plans. The layout for the sensory garden has been completed in the field and plants are being selected from appropriate vendors. All equipment for the playground and splash pad has been secured as well as contractors for the installation. In-house staff is planning to start demo work on the existing playground and splash pad this month.

**Cipri Park**

The existing playground has been removed by our in-house staff. Perfect Turf is set to start the installation of the new playground this month. While the installation of the playground is taking place, the park district will be working on park drainage at this site to improve the area around the playground.

**Sycamore Park**

Staff have been working closely with School District 54 and their contractors at Sycamore Park. The existing playground is set to be removed by Kids Around the World and have that area turned over to the school district for the entryway to the school. Once all topsoil has been removed from the ballfield area, staff will begin restoring the infield of the west field and grassing the outfield. We plan to start the earthwork for the new playground in the last week of June and then start park restoration in August. The northeast ballfield will be a project that will take place in late August into September as this area is currently the staging area for all construction.

**AQUATICS AND BUILDINGS**

***Triphahn Center:***

- A power outage occurred at TC due to a dropped phase at a power pole. This shut down all mechanical equipment and blew one fuse on a pneumatics compressor. All mechanical equipment was restarted successfully.
- Changed the flame sensor on a hydronics boiler.
- Installed a new ballast for lights in the dance room.
- Tightened leaking pump-down solenoids on AHU-1 north side A/C unit.
- A new fan was installed on a condensing unit mini-split for the server room.
- Exhaust fan motor in spa & sauna area went bad and will be replaced.
- Replaced capacitor on RTU 7.
- Cleaned and removed cotton from gym RTU coils.
- Conducted recalibration of spa chemical controller.

### ***Bridges of Poplar Creek:***

- Installed new capacitor for the lobby A/C and unit was charged.
- Installed new pressure washer hose.
- Installed new gear boxes at Toptracer on bays 4 and 8.
- Total Fire came out to clear zone 7 trouble codes for high air pressure – technician adjusted pressure switch.
- Emergency call for downstairs kitchen exhaust fan. Found that motor was locked up – assisted with smoke removal from kitchen and installed new fan.
- Cleaned coil for kitchen condenser units to remove cotton buildup.
- Assembled and installed a new oven in the lower level kitchen.
- Installed concrete patch by the range house at Bridges.

### ***The Club at Prairie Stone:***

- Spa boiler was reported to be making noise – when checked, found that bypass valve in the header was broken. New bypass rebuild kit has been ordered; temporarily using valve from old activity pool boiler until it arrives.
- Ten emergency lights were replaced, per HEFD fire inspection.
- Activity pool Seresco had multiple alarms – and unit going off on low pressure. Filters were replaced and blower wheel & coils were cleaned to restore proper functioning.
- Main urinal line was rodded out in men’s club locker room & diaphragms replaced in toilets in club locker room.
- Back doors were taken apart, the latch was fixed and doors were reinstalled.

### ***Vogelei House/barn:***

- DME found burnt out 3D sensor on the house elevator - parts will be ordered and installed.
- New barn elevator door latch was installed.

### ***Seascape:***

- Rebuilt mechanical seals on the Accutab chlorinators. Installed new motor on the deep end Accutab and rewired the motor on zero depth Accutab motor.

- Lost full power out of the RP1 electrical panel – main breaker blew. The panel was opened and inspected for damage. Turned breakers back on one by one and performed an amp draw on each circuit. Everything tested fine and power was restored.
- Water slides were repaired at the leaking pool.
- Continued grinding and working on cracks and trip hazards around the pool deck.
- Built and installed ADA picnic table at Seascape, as well as new netting.

***Splash Pads/Other:***

- District-wide back flow inspections have been scheduled for June 9-10.

**PARKS**

***Parks & Forestry:***

- Installed new gate & latch at Bo's Run Dog Park and ran new power and data cable to the latch. A new push button box was installed with a weather shield over the credit card reader.
- Lumber was painted and used to repair the fence around the gate at Bo's Run.
- Built dog park ramps and toys for Bo's Run & Freedom Run Dog Parks. Installed new features and removed old wooden structures.
- Adjusted Pine Park timer for pickle ball court lighting and repositioned windscreen.
- Prepped and closed off parking lots for sealcoating at Huntington, South Ridge, and Seascape.
- Algaecide application was done at Princeton basin and Black Bear Disc Golf Park.
- Conducted routine tree maintenance and clean-up at various parks, along with locations per resident requests.
- Prepped for and held seed bombing community event at South Ridge Park.
- Invasive woody plant removal and clean up at North Twin Pond & Winding Trails Basin.
- Shoreline assessment was done at Vogelei, along with weed removal at Vogelei House beds.
- The wood dock at South Ridge was repaired with some new planks/hardware.
- Bridge at Westbury Park was repaired/replaced with new board.
- Landscaping and annuals were installed at Bridges.
- Worked on pruning shrubs at Vogelei and removal of dead shrubs.
- Tree pruning, mulching and clean up were done at the dog parks.

***Playgrounds:***

- Conducted routine playground checks & inspections.
- Dug holes, installed posts, and poured concrete for the shade structure outside of Seascape at Moon Lake Park. Built the rest of the shade structure and installed new shade.
- Fixed pour-in-place surface at Moon Lake playground. Laid sod and completed landscape bed.
- Installed boulder for memorial plaque at Moon Lake Park.
- Tested ThorGuard system at Sycamore, Eisenhower, Vogelei, Bridges and Seascape.
- Spinner was installed at Canterbury Park, near Lincoln Elementary.

- Bench at North Ridge Park was repaired and benches were stained for use at Vogelei.
- New signs were installed at Essex Preserve and “no motor vehicles” sign installed at Fabbrini.
- Turf seeding and leveling was done at Hunters Ridge & Moon Lake Park.
- Cipri playground was delivered and unloaded at the Shop.
- Transported gravel from Seascape to Vogelei.

***Athletic Fields:***

- Striped all soccer game fields, secured nets, inspected bleachers and soccer goals.
- Prepped various baseball fields for games – worked on infields, warning tracks and striped foul lines.
- Weeded along fence lines and warning tracks at several fields and cleared dugouts.
- Moved four new mounds to Cannon and did pitching mound placement. Adjusted bases layout at Cannon 3 and added lines. Mowed at Cannon for baseball tournament prep.
- Striped the cricket fields at Canterbury.

**Recreation Division**

- The Twirling Twisters Baton group were featured on the WGN morning news “Around Town” segment on May 27, filmed at Willow Recreation Center.
- Seascape opened for the season on Thursday May 29.
- Camp starts on June 2 and runs through August 8 and across all 10 weeks there are 3476 registrations for weekly days camps for children 4-14 years old.
- The Spring Dance recital, “GEMS,” was held May 30 to June 1 at Hoffman Estates High School. Four shows were offered with a full audience.

**Early Childhood**

- Threeschool and 2’s Playschool at WRC is not offered for the fall due to the construction that will be taking place in the building. Staff plans to begin advertising in the fall for a January start for these two programs.



**Member Services/Sales & Fitness**

- **May New Member Enrollments:** The Club had another very strong enrollment month in May, enrolling 153 new members. This is yet another record-breaking month, where we have brought in more members in May 2025 than any other May in the past 15 years. We offered an enrollment offer of \$29, reduced from the published rate of \$99. We have sold 163 student summer passes so far for the season.
- **Referral Program Success:** We had another successful month of member referrals, a key indicator of membership satisfaction. In May, we had 34 new members joining as the result of a referral from an existing member. Each member referring received \$25 household credit.
- **United Healthcare Renew Active Program:** We had 110 Renew Active pass holders visit the Club in May, with 5 new members joining through this program in May.
- **Member Engagement and Facility Usage:** April saw 2,494 unique member visits, meaning approximately 76% of our total members actively used the facility during the month. This number does not include our student summer passes, who visit frequently. So, although visits have declined slightly with our month-to-month memberships (as to be expected as the weather gets warmer) the facility has stayed very active with the students back.

- **Community Outreach:** For the third year, The Club was an official host site of the Nationwide Memorial Day Weekend Murph Challenge where members and guests were invited in to participate in an organized and programmed fitness challenge honoring members of the Military. Members and guests had a great time participating together on Memorial Day at The Club.



- **Facility Rentals:** Facility rental numbers slower but steady.
  - 48 volleyball rentals
  - 16 pickleball court rentals
  - 6 pickleball group classes
  - 2 birthday parties
  - 1 basketball court rental
- **Fitness Team/Operations Team Initiatives:** May was a transition/planning month for The Club team, where we traditionally see lower usage due to our members' schedules changing due to school, summer, etc.
  - We offered several pop-up classes throughout the month of May including yoga for stress/anxiety, chair yoga, step, and weights

- As part of our introduction to our new Bollywood! class we added to the group schedule, we offered a combination Bollywood/Zumba! Cinco de Mayo Party for our members in May.
- Much of May was spent finalizing the plan for a busy summer of outdoor fitness events, and upcoming 5K walk/runs. Updates to these exciting events will be provided in future reports!
- Pickleball at The Club is going strong. We will be trying some different offerings going forward, including in a women's league, a youth "mini" camp, and adding a second night of all-level open play to our already successful open play evening, adult indoor league, group classes, and clinics.
- We received the last pieces of our large equipment order this month; two plate loaded pieces our members have been asking us to get for a while:
  - Uni-Lateral Flat Chest Press
  - Incline Lever Row Machine.

## Marketing Report – May 2025

### BRIDGES

In May, Bridges focused on promoting its golf-related offerings and seasonal events through a variety of marketing initiatives. Marketing collateral was created for golf outings, Toptracer Range activities, and various events, with updates made to the Events page. Promotions were developed for Cinco de Mayo, Mother’s Day, and Memorial Day. Wedding marketing continued via Facebook ads and the EverBridal platform, while the Beer Garden menu signage was refreshed to support live music promotions. A series of targeted email blasts throughout the month highlighted key programs like the Jr. Golf Academy, Senior Scramble, golf lessons, and special events including Ladies League nights and Toptracer Range competitions.

### THE CLUB

In May, The Club focused on enhancing its marketing presence and digital performance. Marketing collateral was developed to promote ongoing specials and pop-up fitness classes, with corresponding event pages created and regularly updated. Digital marketing efforts showed positive results, with increased SEO performance and a rise in lead calls through Google Maps.

Website analytics also reflected growth, with improvements in user sessions, total users, and overall engagement time. Additionally, the Google Map Business Profile continued to show steady gains in search visibility, call volume, and click-through rates, indicating strong local SEO traction.

## **OTHER**

In May, staff actively engaged with the community to promote park district programs and events. Team members attended local community events and participated in the SLSF golf committee to support their outing at Bridges. Additionally, attendance at a chamber board meeting provided an opportunity to further promote park district initiatives and strengthen community partnerships.

## **All District May C&M Production Metrics**

In May, the Communications & Marketing (C&M) team led a highly active and multifaceted outreach effort, launching 8 integrated campaigns and 12 minor campaigns to promote a wide array of programs and events. Major focuses included the third phase of the Seascape Opening and Memberships campaign, Outdoor Swim Lessons, the Dolphin Derby, and ongoing promotion of Flag Football. Minor campaigns supported seasonal and league-based programs such as Adult and Youth Sports Leagues, Dance, Figure Skating, and various summer community events like Storytimes in the Park and Freezy Fridays. Two media releases were distributed to the *Daily Herald* for Kids to Parks and the Moon Lake Park Ribbon Cutting; although these weren't picked up by the press, the Twirling Twisters Baton Corps received high-profile TV coverage via WGN's *Around Town*, thanks to a parent connection, providing excellent regional exposure.

The team completed 90 production tasks with 118 sub-tasks, ranging from internal signage to digital and print wall guide maintenance. A major focus was also placed on backend infrastructure, including the migration to a new web host and collaborative work on a website redesign with Prolific Digital. Additionally, production began on the Fall Flipbook Program Guide, introducing enhanced design elements to improve the user experience for residents seeking programs and events.

Email marketing included 12 blasts, but results dipped slightly compared to April. The strategic pivot to "open bait" subject lines and greater focus on paid programs over free events resulted in open and engagement rates falling slightly below established benchmarks (Open Rate: 37.35%, Click Rate: 0.71%). These early trends are being monitored to determine the long-term effectiveness of the new content strategy.

Social media efforts saw a significant ramp-up, with a 35% increase in overall content posted across Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, and Twitter. Facebook, in particular, saw remarkable growth—reach rose by over 260%, content interactions by 202%, and link clicks by over 220%. Instagram also experienced steady gains in engagement and follower growth. Paid posts for Men's Softball and Co-Rec Softball drove the highest reach, while the top-performing organic post was the Moon Lake Park Ribbon Cutting photo album.

Website performance was strong in May, with 20,000 active users and 17,000 new users. The average engagement time stood at 2 minutes and 32 seconds. Traffic was heavily driven by program registration pages, particularly WebTrac search and splash pages. SEO remained effective, with top search queries including "Hoffman Estates Park District," "Seascape," and "summer camp" indicating strong brand visibility and seasonal program interest. Overall, the C&M team's efforts in May positioned the district for a successful summer season while continuing to build momentum across digital, print, and community engagement channels.

**DATE: June 24, 2025**

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**Recommendation**

Recommend to the full board the approval of Resolution R25-002 “Review of Closed Session Minutes and Destruction of Certain Verbatim Recordings” as presented.

**Background**

The park district is required by law to review closed session minutes every six months. The last review was conducted in December 2024.

Additionally, all meeting recordings which are older than 18 months should be destroyed, and the destruction of these recordings will remain on a six-month rolling schedule, approving along with the review and release of the minutes.

The Executive Director has reviewed all closed session minutes from meetings held between February 1993 and December 2014 and has determined that at this time, there is no longer a reason to keep confidential the minutes in the attached list.

**Rationale**

Resolution R25-002 proposes to release the attached (Exhibit A) portions from Executive Session minutes from the years 1993-2014 that pertain to various employment/personnel topics, potential property acquisitions and purchases, litigation, selection of a person to fill a public office, and Executive Director evaluations.

All other Executive Session minutes which have been determined to be confidential shall, if not released by the terms of this Resolution, remain confidential. Resolution R25-002 also states that the Board approves the destruction of the verbatim recordings of those executive session meetings which are older than 18 months and for which the Board has approved the written minutes.
